THE BIG SING

DANCE YOURSELF DIZZY

This class is the perfect way to kick-start your Saturday and sweat off the night before! Come along and learn some choreography to one of the West End and Broadway's most beloved shows. The class is suitable for all ability levels so come along and strut your stuff!

CHOREOGRAPHY - THE BIGGER PICTURE

Want to understand how to build a dance? Fancy creating your own routine? This workshop will demonstrate how to build choreography, utilise formations and direction to get the best out of a cast.
