Our good wishes go to Phil for the future. We do have a new Reg Rep for District 5 and this will be, Des Wilby – welcome back Des.

Many of you know Mike Smith our Regional Representative for District 2 Part of West London. Unfortunately, Mike has had to take temporary leave of absence from his NODA duties owing to health issues. In the meantime, despite 'retiring' Des Wilby has willingly taken on the mantle of looking after District 2 temporarily. As Des is now taking over District 5 we have much delight in welcoming Tom Rainbow on board to look after District 2 until Mike is able to return. Des and Tom you are real stars and Mike we look forward to welcoming you back.

We are also bidding a sad farewell to Tony Austin, the Regional Rep for District 8 Part of West London. It has been a joy to travel more widely throughout the region, visiting societies and appreciating the shows you are staging. It is always so interesting to meet the creative teams where they explain more fully the challenges they have been facing from difficult staging to leading characters having to be recast shortly before opening night. As ever, London region societies rise to the challenge. A number of shows have been 'sell outs' – is a theme emerging that our audiences thirst for live theatre continues unabated ?

Amateur theatre performing groups produce over 3500 productions annually which are watched by audience figures of

more than 2 million every year. These performances include pantomimes, plays and musicals. You are part of this and clearly your excellent shows continue to lift spirits and enhance lives – what an important role we are playing in cultural life.

A number of societies are embracing diversity and inclusivity and you are applauded. This takes the form of societies adopting the ethos of ensuring a production will include a balanced mix ethnicity, gender diversity, backgrounds and the like, as well as societies providing the most popular Relaxed Performances and Sign Language interpreters. It is vitally important to ensure our theatre is available to all whether in the performance role or the audience attendance

We start our proceeding this morning in celebrating the musical aspects of theatre. We are welcoming BMOS (Beaconsfield Musical & Operatic Society) Abbots Langley Gilbert & Sullivan Society and of course, yourselves, to showcase your talents.

This afternoon will be opened for us by our previous winners of The Youngstars Award – Newbury Youngstars who, to entertain us, will stage a mini-performance. It is a delight to see such capable young people engaging in our wonderful and unique hobby – and we can feel sure our future is secure when such talent abounds.

I do hope you enjoy what is your very own special day and you truly feel part of our NODA family.
