4. MINUTES OF THE LAST ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The minutes of the last Annual General Meeting held on 22nd September 2018 were available prior to the meeting. No amendments were required. Adoption of the minutes was proposed by: Margaret Coltman, Seconded by Gordon Harris and agreed by all.

NODA President Jacquie Stedman signed the Minutes in view of the meeting.

5. Adoption of the Council's Report for the period ending 31st December 2018.

The report was presented by Michael Hastilow the Chairman of Trustees as follows:

The report on behalf of Council was included in the Annual Review and no questions were submitted prior to this meeting. The main Achievements are set out in the Chairman's Report included in the Annual Review for 2018.

Staff has been stable for the last 12 months under the leadership of Dale Freeman our chief operating officer, with Rob, Marketing and Publishing Executive taking on the design of NODA Today and many of the documents you have for this week-end., Summer School students will recognize Bev Clarke.

Since last years Conference, Council has made a full review of our Constitution and later you will have the opportunity of approving the changes we propose. They iron out the anomalies we found in operating the constitution and although there are many, they should allow for a smoother operation of the Association.

The one major change is the provision for a Vice Chairman. This is a role which has been missing and the opportunity of formalizing the position has been included. Council have nominated Ian Cox for this position, I am sure he will do the role justice

I have to report that the services of our Appeals Tribunal were required this year, the first in most people's memory and I must record a vote of thanks to the diligence of the three members who took part, Stewart Adkins, Sue DuPont and Michael Avery.

Finally, in reviewing our governance procedures we feel that the role of an Honorary Solicitor is no longer sustainable and after this year, the post will not be filled. In doing so I must pay tribute to Christopher Harper who has held the role for as long as I can remember. Christopher's father was President in 1989/90 and we owe a debt of gratitude for the service made to our Association over so many years. A presentation was made to Christopher by the President. Christopher thanked everyone on the Council.

The Chairman then invited Nick Lawrence to give a review of the work of summer school – August 2019 saw another successful week at Yarnfield Park with 220 students studying 13 courses across

Musical Theatre, Drama and Technical Skills. There has been a slight shift in the way things are done which is a natural development when a new Director has been appointed. Sarah Osborne could not be here today but she has proved beyond any doubt that she has the good of the school at heart and is fully committed to its ethos and continuation. The calibre of our tutors is exceptional and they all bring their own inimitable style and talent. We thank them all, new and established for their ability to deliver diverse courses and for building on the wonderful reputation that we have for enabling our students to learn from the best in the business.

Socially too choices were expanded with live music from a ceilidh band fronted by one of our students with accompanying tutors and students on other instruments. Extra activities included student led warm ups, sessions run by students and tutors, massage therapy among others.

The visitors' day (held on the Wednesday) Regional committee members to attend and share the experience with their societies. Do join us next year, the school will run from 1st to 8th August at a new venue.

The President then added that in 1988 Peter Spencer attended his first summer school and has attended ever since and Denis Stallard attended this year and has done since the 1970's.

The Consolidated Accounts were published and circulated as part of the Association's Annual Review.

Together with a detailed report on our finances .Further copies are available today. No questions were submitted prior to this meeting.

The Key points are

Subscriptions netted £251,825

The profits remitted to the Association by NODA Ltd amounted to £116,994

Net surplus before the revaluation of our Investments was £ 53,630

Investments were affected by the political unrest and reduced in value by £36,156

(Most of this deficit has reversed as of today)

Net Surplus in the year became £17,474

If there are any questions I will attempt to answer them. There were no questions from the floor.

The President asked for the Proposal to adopt the Accounts as a true record - Proposed by Chris Ingram, Seconded by Fred Piggford and agreed by all.

10. AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE ASSOCIATION

The detailed amendments have been circulated prior to the meeting. The Council propose adoption of the New Constitution. The background to the need for the changes was highlighted in the comments by the Chairman in his introduction of the Trustees Report.

A question was raised around Clause 24 of the role of Vice Chairman and why not automatic progression to Chairman . The President explained that someone may be prepared to take on the role of Vice Chair but not necessarily wish to fulfill the role of Chairman and this allows that. It is not an automatic right unless that is the option of the Vice Chair.

The Council proposal was seconded by Bert Lumsden and a detailed count was made which was as follows:

The Proxies held were 18 for, 2 against and 1 abstention.

We reported on having 3093 Members, Quorum is 2.5% of membership ie 77 which was achieved. The change of Constitution required 3/4 of members voting to be in favour. The amendments To the constitution were therefore approved.

11. NODA LTD BOARD REPORT

The President read a statement prepared by Eric Smart Chairman of our Trading Company, NODA LTD who apologised for his absence today:

I am sorry not to be with you this weekend to share in the celebrations and to participate in this meeting in person.

NODA Limited has had a very good year resulting in a sum in excess of £117k being transferred to the charity through Gift Aid.

Two changes have taken place which warrant special mention from me –

First the addition of a number of new badges to our range of Long Service Awards, which incidentally, are proving very popular with members.

Second, we made a change to the way in which we receive commission from premiums on NODA Insurance. Instead of accepting a bonus when we have a good year, we opted to have increased assured commission rates on the premiums.

This decision was based on the history of past receipts and we have not been disappointed. The position will continue to be monitored. I do hope you all have a very successful and enjoyable weekend- Eric
