Poster and Programme Competition

NODA's annual Programme and Poster Competition is a very popular competition for societies and highlights the promotion of amateur theatre in the UK. Its purpose is to encourage high standards in programme and poster design.

Each region holds their own competition, using the criteria set out below, with the winning entries then put forward to the national competition. Trophies for the winners and runners up of the national competition are currently awarded at the NODA Annual General Meeting.

Criteria for judging 2022 - 2024 programme and poster competition entries

(Please note that these criteria apply to entries for shows between 1st January and 31st December in each of these years and come into effect 1st January 2022)

It is important to note that it is a condition of entry for all programmes and posters that:

- the official NODA logo with the strapline 'Be inspired by amateur theatre' is included in the programme or poster.
- 'An introduction to NODA' is also to be included (in programmes only.)

The current versions of the logo and the new version of 'Introduction to NODA' (to fit all styles of media) can always be found as downloads on the **P&P competition page** on the website for use in the programmes and/or posters.

The name of the various classes of programme and posters are taken from the trophies which are awarded to that particular class of entry.

Peacock Class Programmes - 24 sides or over including cover

Perkins Class Programmes - 16-20 sides including cover

Barnes Class Programmes - Up to 12 sides including cover

Thomson-Leng - for Posters - min A5, max A3 - electronic or physical format

For your scenery, costumes, musical scores, instruments and more.

Covers accidental and physical loss of money either from production venue, at a member's house or in transit.

Personal Accident

Covers accidents for up to 45 members or volunteer helpers (more if needed).

Exclusions

This insurance does not include damage or loss under the following circumstances:

- Any unattended motor vehicles
- Fragile or rare property such as precious metals and fur
- Musical instruments as specified on the policy wording
- · Liabilities covered by other insurance policies
- Abandonment caused by inadequate ticket sales, withdrawl of sponsorship and adverse weather conditions for open air performances

Covers reasonable cost and expenses if you have to abandon a production (as long as it's not your fault).

Provides personal indemnity for your past, present and future committee members should the following investigations take place or fines be issued for:

- · Actual or alleged wrongful acts
- Wrongful employment acts eg. discrimination or harassment
- Legal representation costs
- Civil fines and penalties
- Former committee members -72-month discovery period
- Emergency costs and expenses

Charity Liability

The society will be indemnified for:

Emergency costs and expenses Social media, public relations, consultancy fees

Exclusions

- Any litigation that was notified before this cover was purchased
- Where a member of the committee has acted dishonestly or fraudulently
- Pension trusteeship or administration

NODA takes the role of youth as one of its main priorities and has a youth coordinator role within each of its regions as the 'go to' person to speak to regarding current legislation, safeguarding issues and any local society problems you may face in your society. Overseeing the youth coordinator nationally is the national youth co-ordinator.

Alternatively feel free to contact head office staff - contact info@noda.org.uk. NODA Head Office staff are trained in safeguarding support and are experienced in youth theatre so are able to support with child licencing through to general safeguarding queries.

On our website, in partnership with the National Association of Youth Theatre you will find many factsheets specifically for youth theatre and working with children.

As part of your NODA membership, you can also get your DBS check completed through NODA. NODA offers standard checks through to Enhanced with Child Barred List checks. For volunteers this charge is £20 per check. If you would like more information on DBS checks, please contact head office on 01733 374 790.

If you suspect a child or vulnerable adult is at risk then contact Social Services or the police without delay.



NODA Safe



Theatre is about fun, enjoyment and putting on a great show. It's not about form filling and health and safety – we all do that at work and that is the last thing we want to do in our hobby!

However (and it's a very big however), we're sure you'd agree that everyone involved in your show, from your leading lady to that last minute audience member, all have the absolute right to enjoy the production without fear of accident, injury or worse.

NODASafe is here to help you achieve this goal, not by saying 'No', but by working with you to overcome your safety concerns and make your production better by making it safer. NODASafe is a partnership between **NODA** and **Health and Safety Mentor**. HSM is run by people who understand theatre and have personal activity in the community theatre environment, so we know what pressures and challenges face NODA societies on a show-to-show basis.

As part of your subscription to NODA, you are now able to access the services listed below from NODASafe.

Telephone and email support services to help with:

- Production safety queries
- · General advice and guidance on all health, safety and environmental issues
- Dealing with serious accidents
- Risk assessments
- Completing the recommended NODASafe assessments and checklists
- Generic theatre and show risk assessments great for stage managers and the production team

- Production checklists these help to plan your production and integrate safety into what you do
- Production documents plan your production thoroughly and make sure easily overlooked information is included in simple to use documents
- Access to training courses details of these dedicated and discounted services become available occasionally, so keep an eye out for information.

There are certain aspects of theatre health and safety that you might need to look at that are not covered by your subscription service. However, NODASafe can provide these services to you, including discounted fire risk assessments, general risk assessments (for your rehearsal space or theatre), specific risk assessments and accident investigation visits.

Long Service Awards

NODA offers a superb and totally exclusive range of medals, bars, badges and certificates for your society to present to members, to show appreciation and to commemorate their years of service to amateur theatre.

What can I apply for?

From badges to medals, there is something for all budgets. Show off your long service with the 25 year long service medal. You can add a silver bar for every 5 years additional service up to 50 years, where you will be entiled to the 50 year gold bar and, at 60 years' service, the exclusive diamond bar If you wanted something a bit less formal, then the long service badges fit the bill. A different badge for every 5 years of service.

Who can apply?

The awards are intended for those who, week after week, attend rehearsals or spend many hours on backstage or administrative work and whose services are essential/indispensable to putting on shows. 'Occasional' service, e.g. just for a show week itself, does not qualify and generalised descriptions of duties such as backstage, FOH, programmes, tickets, committee, officer or helper are insufficient. Payment for services to the amateur theatre other than to the sponsoring societies, however, does not preclude the person from being given an award.

How do I apply?

If you are a member of a society then, the society will have to apply on your behalf. This can be done via our online application portal or by hard copy form. If you are a NODA individual or joint member, you will be able to apply directly for your award via the online application portal or by hard copy form.

What if I don't qualify?

Those who do not qualify for one of the long service awards may be entitled to wear the NODA commendation award, especially if they are in receipt of remuneration or do not serve amateur theatre on a weekly basis. Please note - 10 years' minimum service to amateur theatre is required before a nominee can be considered for this award.

Youth Awards

A youth award and certificate may be awarded from the first youth show performed to a maximum age of 20.
